



SIEGEL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Description: The goal of the Siegel Family Scholarship is to help young people who face challenges to develop their potential, achieve their goals and become successful and productive adults. This scholarship is based on merit and demonstrated financial need.

Scholarship Criteria:

- Recipient will be a recent high school graduate (within 1-2 years of graduation) who is a resident of the greater Newark, New Jersey area.
- Preference will be given to students who have been actively involved with GlassRoots, Inc. (Newark, NJ) and/or Big Brothers Big Sisters of Essex, Hudson & Union Counties.
- Recipient has been accepted into an accredited college/university within the United States of America. Recipient will be in pursuit of their undergraduate degree (B.A. or B.S.) in the field of study of their choice and attending school on a full-time basis. Initial enrollment in a community college is permitted.
- Student will maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better.

Scholarship Selection: Applicants will be evaluated based on several factors including but not limited to academic performance, leadership, extra-curricular activities, work experience (whether paid or unpaid), financial need and references. Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the Foundation's Board of Trustees based upon the recommendation of its respective Scholarship Committee.

Terms of Scholarship Award: Each year the Siegel Family Scholarship Fund will offer up to four (4) scholarships. Award amount will vary dependent upon the student's demonstrated need, but no award will be greater than \$10,000. The amount of the award will be applied equally between the academic year fall and spring semesters. It is important to note that a copy of the student's school tuition bill and a final financial aid statement will be required prior to release of any award.

The scholarship is renewable for up to an additional three (3) consecutive years in the amount of up to \$10,000 each year dependent upon the student's demonstrated need and provided the student continues to meet the criteria listed above. Student will be required to submit a brief narrative of their past year experience at college, an official transcript, proof of continued enrollment as a full-time student in good academic standing and demonstrated need (tuition bill and financial aid letter). The scholarship award will be paid directly to the educational institution for credit to the student's account and may be used to offset educational expenses such as tuition, room and board and other mandatory educational fees.
