

**Scholarship Description:** The vision for the Morristown Neighborhood House's scholarship program is to make the dream of an education a reality for young people ~ to continue to provide a sense of support from home, to help them develop their potential, achieve their goals and become successful and productive adults. This scholarship is based on merit and demonstrated financial need.

#### Scholarship Criteria:

### To be considered for a scholarship you must:

- Have been associated with Neighborhood House in some way, e.g., program participant, volunteer, or child of a staff member.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Have applied and been accepted to an accredited college or technical school within the United States.

**Important to Note:** You and a parent and/or guardian may be asked to participate in a personal interview with the Committee.

**Scholarship Selection:** Applicants will be evaluated based on a number of factors including but not limited to academic performance, leadership, extra-curricular activities, and financial need. Scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the Foundation's Board of Trustees based upon the recommendation of its respective Scholarship Committee.

**Terms of Scholarship Award**: Award amounts will vary. It is important to note that a copy of the student's school tuition bill and a <u>final</u> financial aid statement will be required prior to release of any award. The scholarship award will be paid directly to the educational institution for credit to the student's account and may be used to offset educational expenses such as tuition, room and board and other mandatory educational fees.

**Deadline:** Applications <u>and</u> all required supplemental documentation should be returned via **email to fkrueger@cfnj.org no later than June 1, 2023**. Only complete applications will be considered by the selection committee.
